

Catalog of Services for Open Access Publications at JOVIS Verlag

Dear authors and editors,

In order to best assist you in planning and submitting your proposal, we would like to provide you with information about the costs and included publishing services related to the open access model. Publishing open access means that the revenue from regular bookshop sales of the electronic version is lost. Additional costs are also incurred for the editorial and technical provisioning of the open access version. Open access fees are charged on this basis. The fees depend on the time of activation:

- The cost for activation simultaneous with the print edition is EUR 9,000.00 net plus VAT.
- The cost for later activation after an embargo period of at least twenty-four months is EUR 2,800.00 net plus VAT.

In consultation with you, we will determine the Creative Commons license under which the publication is to appear. Even with a later open access release after the print edition has been published, the Creative Commons license should be clarified at an early stage, and the later open access status should be taken into account when obtaining image rights. Editorial Supervision and Quality Assurance

- Personal support and professional project management by the editorial team
- Assistance with selecting a title and drafting promotional materials
- Formal manuscript review and check by the editorial team
- Embedding of the publication in a curated, highquality scholarly publishing program with clear identification as an open access publication

Production

- E-book preparation in PDF format
- ISBN assignment
- DOI assignment at work and chapter level
- Technical and editorial provisioning under the agreed Creative Commons license on the platforms www.jovis.de and www.degruyter.com with clear identification as an open access publication and free download function (PDF individual chapters as well as overall PDF)

Distribution and Open Access Distribution Structures

- Long-term archiving of the e-book via Portico and the German National Library
- Delivery of the e-book to the open access platform OAPEN
- Indexing in the Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB)
- Notification of the title to the Library of Congress
- Mandatory copy delivery to the German National Library (DNB) and the Berlin Central and Regional Library (ZLB)
- Provision of metadata (MARC 21/ONIX) to libraries, bookstores, library discovery systems, and A&I services such as EBSCO, ExLibris, OCLC, ProQuest/Serials Solutions, Suweco CZ, TDNet, and Yewno



Marketing and Press Work

- Marketing of the publication as an open access title through all relevant channels: bookstore previews, website, social media, newsletter, topicspecific mailings
- Standard press work from the publishing house
